Work Oversight

- BNL's QMO will be conducting work oversight surveillances in April
- A lab-wide effectiveness review for work oversight by DOE occurs in July
- Improper work oversight has been related to many past events at BNL

Expectations

- Managers, Group Leaders, and Supervisors must be observing and interacting with their staff in their workspace
- Determine if work is performed as planned
- Ensure workers understand C-AD procedures
- Ensure workers are following rules
- Show continuous improvement

Work Oversight Practices at C-AD

- Manager Work Observations
- ASSRC, ESRC and RSC walk downs prior to start up
- Job Risk Assessments
- Pre-job briefings / Post-job feedback
- Supervisor, Project Engineer, Liaison Engineer, Liaison Physicist, Project Physicist oversight at work areas
- Operations Coordinator oversight of shift activities
- Shift Leader oversight of PHENIX or STAR shift activities
- Maintenance Coordinator oversight of maintenance day activities

Photo of the Week: Worker Planned Work

The worker

- Conducts a pre-job walk-down which provides an opportunity to see the jobsite firsthand and assess the physical aspects of the job
- Plans the work
- Identifies the hazards and appropriate hazard controls to be used
- Determines that they have the skill, experience, and current training to perform the job safely
