Powered Machine Guarding - SBMS

- Retro-fit all non-compliant equipment (e-stop, guards (OSHA), anti-restart)
- C-AD is working at the pace of closing 5 compliance issues per month
- C-AD has about 250 machines in 28 machine shops
- All dangerous machines are placed out of service



Parts of the Powered Machine Requiring Guarding - OSHA

- **Point of Operation:** Area where machine performs work on material
- **Power Transmission Apparatus:** Belts, gears, flywheels, chains, pulleys, spindles, couplings, cams, machine components that transmit energy
- **Other Moving Parts:** Reciprocating, rotating, cutting, bending, shearing, any traversing motions, auxiliary machine parts
