# Careful Work Planning and Hazard Analyses

- Walking and working surface hazards serve as reminders of the need for careful work planning and analysis of hazards and the responsibility to stop work or adjust your awareness when surface conditions change
- Weather can quickly change the walking or working surface conditions and slip and fall hazards should be part of work planning – including the slip and fall hazards that arise when going to and from work
- Slip simulator training reduces the fall rate; data show up to 70% reduction
- This training also reinforces basic slip and fall prevention principles

# Automatic Fire-Alarm Notification Outage at RHIC

- At this time, buildings in RHIC are affected by a fire-alarm communications outage that does not alert the BNL site emergency responders
- 1004,1004B,1005S, 1101, 1010, 1002, 1002B, 1012 are affected
- An alarm will annunciate in the building but the alarm is not being transmitted to the firehouse
- Fire alarm electricians are working on the problem
- When a fire alarm in these buildings annunciates, please evacuate and call the firehouse (x911 or x2222)

# Emergency Test of Phone System in Building 911

- Monday, February 29, at 3 pm, staff in building 911 will hear a voice and “beep beep beep” over their office phone
- This is a large-scale test of the BNL emergency system to alert people in building 911 of an emergency
- It will take only a few seconds after which you can clear the phone screen
