FUN, FACTS & FIGURES: NEW YORK SIGHTSEEING TOUR

Our tour will begin west and north, past Macy's (The Largest Store in the World), up Sixth Avenue (Avenue of the Americas - home of some of the largest corporations in the U.S.), through Columbus Circle, past the imposing buildings of Lincoln Center and the famous Chagall paintings at The Metropolitan Opera House, and on to 72nd Street where they will pass by The Dakota (where John Lennon lived - and died!).

The tour will take a quick venture into Central Park on foot to see Yoko Ono's tribute to her late husband - "Strawberry Fields". Then, the tour will proceed east, down Fifth Avenue, past the famous museums of "Museum Mile" including The Metropolitan, The Guggenheim, The Cooper Hewitt and The Frick, where guests will see some of the prime expensive real estate owned by some of New York's wealthiest families. The tour continues south down Fifth Avenue, past The Plaza Hotel, FAO Schwarz (the largest toy store for children of all ages), past Tiffany's and the Trump Towers. Proceeding further south, guests will enjoy some of the sights of the ethnic neighborhoods which make up this city, including Little Italy, Chinatown, also Greenwich Village and Soho.

The tour ends with a visit to Ground Zero and to the surrounding memorial. From here, we go on to St. Paul's Chapel, the oldest church in the city (1766), and walk past Wall Street the New York Stock Exchange and Federal Hall. This is the perfect photo opportunities, as Wall Street is an area like no other in the city.

CENTRAL PARK WALKING TOUR

While enjoying a guided walking tour, guests will pass some of the most interesting sites in the park, such as the Central Park Boathouse overlooking the lake, the Great Lawn, Bethesda Fountain, and "Strawberry Fields" – Yoko Ono's tribute to John Lennon. Central Park is America's first landscaped urban park and is as beautiful as ever.

THE INSIDER'S CHINATOWN & LITTLE ITALY EXCURSION

There has been a major revitalization in Chinatown, bringing attention to the deep cultural & social significance to one of New York's most famous neighborhoods. Chinatown New York City, the largest Chinatown in the United States, is located in one of the oldest neighborhoods in Manhattan. Founded in the late 1870's by Chinese immigrants, Chinatown offers a unique historical and cultural experience not found anywhere else in the world. Often overlooked, Chinatown is the site of a rich history that not only tells the story of the Chinese-American experience, but also that of early Irish, Jewish and Italian immigrants.

In addition to learning the rich history and culture of Chinatown, guests will be introduced to many of the food and tea establishments where they can take a sample taste! Such stops may be made at the Chinese Ice Cream Factory, the herb shop and of course the Tea Shop. But best of all, guests will walk along Canal Street, keeping an eye out for the best knock-off shopping.

The tour will also stop at Little Italy – the famous neighborhood is shrinking and is not confined to Mulberry Street. We'll walk down the cobblestone streets and learn the history while smelling the delicious cannolis being made at the Italian bakeries.

A VISIT TO THE STATUE OF LIBERTY & ELLIS ISLAND

We will make our way downtown to Battery Park where you will board the ferry to Liberty Island and Ellis Island (one ticket provides admission to both islands). The Statue of Liberty is probably one of America's most well-known monuments. Miss Liberty was given to the U.S. as a gift from France in 1886, sculpted by August Bartholdi along with the help of Gustave Eiffel (creator of the Eiffel Tower). Here you will have a chance to take up-close and personal photos of Ms. Liberty and visit the inside of her base. Climbing to the crown has been closed since 9/11.

At Ellis Island, visitors are transported back through the portals of time - to the story chronicling the fate of more than 12 million immigrants who passed through the doors of Ellis Island from 1892 to 1954. Here you may view the film "Island of Hope - Island of Tears" which will draw you into the human drama of Ellis Island. Then, perhaps we may take an audio tour through the museum- guests will receive individual audio cassette players, which provide a fascinating commentary (available in several languages). The fascinating commentary will escort guests through the buildings, the story and the history of immigration. Perhaps you will find an ancestor. There will be time for you to stop at the Ellis Island cafeteria, at your discretion.

A SOHO AND CHELSEA GALLERY CRAWL

This eclectic neighborhood in lower Manhattan had a long history before becoming New York City's artistic haven. The SoHo that surrounds us now, with its cast-iron warehouses and cobblestone streets arose in the 1850's after the residential population moved uptown. By the 1970's SoHo developed into a community, transforming itself into an artistic zone. Today we will walk through SoHo visiting galleries and making our way up to Chelsea-the "hottest and newest" area for artists to display their work. This neighborhood is bursting with galleries, dealerships and street artists.

Then it's on to the neighborhood Chelsea where over the past several years has experienced a huge renaissance in art. This West Side neighborhood is home to some of the trendiest galleries in the world with some of the most Avant-garde artists displaying modern and ground breaking work. Along the tour we will stop at several galleries that display a multitude and variety of art. The tour may meet with a gallery owner or curator to elaborate on the exhibit and touch on salient points of the show. We will also stop and visit the unique and new Chelsea Marketplace.

MoMA: THE MUSEUM OF MODERN ART

Throughout its history, The Museum of Modern Art has used architecture as a vehicle for self-renewal and regeneration. The recently completed building project represents MoMA's most extensive redefinition since its founding seventy-five years ago. The Museum combines new spaces with MoMA's original architecture to dramatically enhance its dynamic collection of modern and contemporary art. The tour will consist of a one hour private tour with a MoMA docent, followed by time on your own to explore the museum.

THE METROPOLITAN MUSEUM OF ART

The MET is one of the most famous institutions in New York.. This museum is considered one of the finest art museums in the world and exhibits the largest number of works (several hundred thousand) dating from prehistoric times to the present. Our guests are met by a docent on arrival and guided through the museum on a customized one-hour "highlights" tour. There will be time to wander the museum at their leisure after the tour.
